Weekly Update

With a new year comes new projects and initiatives and I am pleased that this week we have been able to proceed with our plans and put into place two more really exciting projects.

When I first joined the school some eleven years ago one of the highlights in the Reception classes was the walks over the Country Park. Over the years we have adapted these and then with COVID, they became difficult to organise taking into account the restrictions. I am pleased that this week the Early Years Team has set five dates for the Spring Term when we will be taking the children for a walk over the Country Park to explore the big outdoors and see where their inquisitive nature leads them. The teachers will be putting more details for parents on *Tapestry* as inevitably the weather could be cold and damp so we will need to wrap up warm and of course, we need parents to volunteer to accompany us. Being outside in the fresh air is so good for the children but also we have a wonderful setting and we want the children to appreciate the natural world so that they can understand our responsibility to look after it.

The teachers have also now fully explored *Spelling Shed* and today Miss Johnston, as our English lead, is sending home a letter via parentmail to parents from Year 2 through to Year 6 about this online resource which children can use at home to practise their spellings through games and fun activities. A lot of the activities allow the children to revise spelling patterns and common exception words that they have already been taught – you will be amazed how many children even in the juniors continually misspell common words such as *was* – *woz*.

Spelling Shed has been purchased by the DPSA to support all our children in their learning and parents often request ideas for how they can help at home. This is just another example of how important the fundraising efforts of the DPSA are and how vital your support is. A big thank you to the DPSA officers and the committee who work tirelessly for the benefit of the children at our school!

Child Safety and the Metaverse

Christmas has now come to a close and a new year has begun. As pupils and staff return to school, the annual playground inquisition will begin. Among their peer group young people will begin to discuss what they got for Christmas. For many the answer will almost certainly be 'a Fortnite battle pass, a new PC, a PlayStation 5 etc'. All devices which allow both unfettered access to the internet and expose children to voice chat, text chat and photo sharing with complete strangers.

This year presents an acceleration of vulnerability window as, VR headsets, connected to Facebook's Metaverse have been released onto the marketplace. The Metaverse seeks to link users to the internet as a Virtual Entity through the use of Virtual Reality Headsets. This amplifies the danger children are exposed to online. Over the coming months it will be vital for parents and schools to understand these Christmas gifts and the issues linked to them.

Reception Admission for September 2023

The primary school (Reception) admission round opened on **Monday 7 November 2022**, for parents of children to apply for a Reception school place for the academic year that starts in September 2023. The statutory national closing date for applications is **15 January 2023**.

From 7 November 2022, applications can be made online via <u>www.essex.gov.uk/admissions</u> and 99% parents in Essex applied online last year. All the application information is also available on the website above.

Find out what to do if your child is unwell

We have been contacted by the Mid Essex Alliance, part of Mid and South Essex Integrated Care System (ICS) to share this important information with you. Across mid and south Essex, there is continued pressure on local health systems. **Data shows that there is increasing paediatric emergency presentation in local A&E departments. However, for much of the time, the outcome of the attendance is recorded as self-care/advice and no treatment is given.**

As a response, the ICS has re-launched a campaign to promote the **Children's Health Matters guide**, updated with new information for winter 2022/23. The free guide was co-designed with local parents and is packed with expert advice and guidance on what to do when children are unwell with common childhood illnesses. **It explains how to treat children at home, when to see a GP or call 111, and when symptoms are more serious and you should seek emergency help.**

In addition to the CHM guide, they have a family health newsletter that families can subscribe to - subscribers get 10 weekly email newsletters each covering a different aspect of family health and wellbeing - the link to subscribe is below:

This is the eligibility criteria ECC use: <u>Entitlement and what is required</u>

The Government set the criteria for free school meal entitlement. To be entitled, you need to receive: Universal Credit with an annual income of £7,400 or less

- Income Support
- Income Based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income Related Employment & Support Allowance
- Pension Guarantee Credit
- Child Tax Credit (But not working tax credit) with an annual income of less than £16,190
- Parents with Asylum Seeker status who receive support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Working Tax Credit 'Run-on' the payment someone may receive for a further 4 weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
