Weekly Update

I am sure that parents will have heard the news and be concerned about the possible industrial action in schools. Members of the NEU have voted to take action with the first day of a planned strike on Wednesday 1st February. Other unions have voted in favour of industrial action but have not reached the legal threshold. We are hoping that the government will spend the coming weeks meeting with the unions to move to a position where this strike action can be averted.


In the meantime, I am working with Mr Sutton, our Chair of Governors, to prepare the school community for potential disruption taking into account guidance from the DfE, the Local Authority and all the educational unions. We will keep everyone informed of the situation and provide more information as soon as we have a clearer idea of how Danbury Park School will be affected.

As you know attendance at school is vitally important and as part of our regular monitoring we look at pupils' attendance over time. Over the coming week we will be looking at the attendance reports for every pupil for the Autumn Term. Where attendance is below 90% and we do not have a reasonable explanation (e.g. longer term sickness, such as Chickenpox or chest infection; previously notified long term, whether authorised of not) we will be contacting parents to make them aware of the situation, to inform them of the implications and to offer support where the situation is more complex. We do understand that sometimes a child is too unwell to attend school and that being at home is the best place for them.

We all want our children to achieve their best and do well, so it should be borne in mind that absences will have a negative impact on pupils' educational attainment and progress as well as their social and personal development. A pupil who takes ten days' absence will only attain 94.7% attendance in the year. Ten days' absence means the pupil will miss at least 50 hours of education, which means areas of the curriculum may be missed and not revisited until the next year.

Safeguarding Announcing NSPCC Listen Up, Speak Up

To start the year the NSPCC has unveiled their new *Listen Up, Speak Up* campaign, aimed at giving adults practical advice, about how to address concerns about a child. The research from the NSPCC shows that at the moment the world of under-18s is in the midst of a spike in concern flagging. From April 2021 to March 2022 the NSPCC Helpline spoke 8,347 times with adults, compared to 7,338 in the same period for the previous year.

Often when adults are concerned about a child, the question is "What do I do?" This is even more problematic when parents may know the child well, or know the family well and it will almost certainly put them in a difficult position. Trait at Parts We have been contacted by the Mid Essex Alliance, part of Mid and South Essex Integrated Care System (ICS) to share this important information with you. Across mid and south Essex, there is continued pressure on local health systems. **Data shows that there is increasing paediatric emergency presentation in local A&E departments. However, for much of the time, the outcome of the attendance is recorded as self-care/advice and no treatment is given.**

As a response, the ICS has re-launched a campaign to promote the **Children's Health Matters guide**, updated with new information for winter 2022/23. The free guide was co-designed with local parents and is packed with expert advice and guidance on what to do when children are unwell with common childhood illnesses. **It explains how to treat children at home, when to see a GP or call 111, and when symptoms are more serious and you should seek emergency help.**

In addition to the CHM guide, they have a family health newsletter that families can subscribe to - subscribers get 10 weekly email newsletters each covering a different aspect of family health and wellbeing - the link to subscribe is below:

This is the eligibility criteria ECC use: <u>Entitlement and what is required</u>

The Government set the criteria for free school meal entitlement. To be entitled, you need to receive: Universal Credit with an annual income of £7,400 or less

- Income Support
- Income Based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income Related Employment & Support Allowance
- Pension Guarantee Credit
- Child Tax Credit (But not working tax credit) with an annual income of less than £16,190
- Parents with Asylum Seeker status who receive support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Working Tax Credit 'Run-on' the payment someone may receive for a further 4 weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
