Weekly Update

The senior leadership team and I are continuing to work on our risk assessment related to the potential disruption caused by the industrial action planned for Wednesday 1st February. We are working on a range of scenarios and these contain many variables. As you may be aware members of the NEU do not have to inform the headteacher in advance that they are taking action, so in some cases I may not know the exact position until Wednesday morning. One of the key issues is to assess whether there are sufficient staff available for the school to remain open, or partially open, during a strike.

When a strike takes place, those taking action stop work and withdraw their labour. This means that those teachers involved in the action will not teach their class or undertake any other duties on a strike day. This action is also affecting those teachers who work on a supply basis. Support staff may also be taking action but if not they may have childcare difficulties for their own families on the day and therefore not be able to attend work. This means that for health and safety reasons, we will have limited options to keep all classes open.

I will be discussing the risk assessment in detail with Mr Sutton, our Chair of Governors, on Monday morning at which point we hope to be able to provide parents and carers with more specific information. However I do feel that parents should be prepared for the situation where their child's class may have to be closed and that you may not know until Wednesday morning at 8.30am when you will be notified by Parent Mail.

Clearly this is a difficult situation, which will cause some disruption. I would ask you, however, to be understanding. A national strike by teachers is *very* unusual. Taking strike action is not something that any teacher would undertake lightly. Those on strike will have thought long and hard about their decision and will also lose pay for the days that they are on strike.

Safeguarding Announcing NSPCC Listen Up, Speak Up

To start the year the NSPCC has unveiled their new *Listen Up, Speak Up* campaign, aimed at giving adults practical advice, about how to address concerns about a child. The research from the NSPCC shows that at the moment the world of under-18s is in the midst of a spike in concern flagging. From April 2021 to March 2022 the NSPCC Helpline spoke 8,347 times with adults, compared to 7,338 in the same period for the previous year.

Often when adults are concerned about a child, the question is "What do I do?" This is even more problematic when parents may know the child well, or know the family well and it will almost certainly put them in a difficult position. We have been contacted by the Mid Essex Alliance, part of Mid and South Essex Integrated Care System (ICS) to share this important information with you. Across mid and south Essex, there is continued pressure on local health systems. Data shows that there is increasing paediatric emergency presentation in local A&E departments. However, for much of the time, the outcome of the attendance is recorded as self-care/advice and no treatment is given.

As a response, the ICS has re-launched a campaign to promote the **Children's Health Matters guide**, updated with new information for winter 2022/23. The free guide was co-designed with local parents and is packed with expert advice and guidance on what to do when children are unwell with common childhood illnesses. **It explains how to treat children at home**, when to see a **GP or call 111**, and when symptoms are more serious and you should seek emergency help.

In addition to the CHM guide, they have a family health newsletter that families can subscribe to - subscribers get 10 weekly email newsletters each covering a different aspect of family health and wellbeing - the link to subscribe is below:

This is the eligibility criteria ECC use:

Entitlement and what is required

The Government set the criteria for free school meal entitlement. To be entitled, you need to receive: Universal Credit with an annual income of £7,400 or less

- Income Support
- Income Based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income Related Employment & Support Allowance
- Pension Guarantee Credit
- Child Tax Credit (But not working tax credit) with an annual income of less than £16,190
- Parents with Asylum Seeker status who receive support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Working Tax Credit 'Run-on' the payment someone may receive for a further 4 weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
