Weekly News

Next week there is the proposed industrial action by members of the NEU on both **Wednesday 15th and Thursday 16th**. As soon as I know (and am able to share) which classes will be affected, I will inform parents by Parentmail but please consider your contingency plans over the weekend.

The last two weeks of Book Fortnight have been a great opportunity for the children to share their love of reading as well as their passion for environmental issues. On Tuesday I hosted a meeting for teachers from schools in the Chelmsford area to share with them the school's *Our World, Our Future* project. I explained how it came about through a small group of Year 5 pupils coming to me with their concerns over the future of the planet and asking for help. From that tiny plea came our whole school curriculum, where all the children learn systematically about changes we can make and the impact, as well as the installation of solar panels, which on a sunny day make such a difference to our electricity consumption.



We raised £202.12 from the donations for our dressing up day and Miss Johnston is working with the Reading Council to decide what books to buy. Thank you to everyone who donated. Next week we are changing the displays around the school to showcase the children's work and over the coming weeks each class will share in the newsletter their specific class projects.

We are collecting donations for Comic Relief so please send these into school in your child's book bag. CHILDREN'S HEALTH MATTERS



We have been contacted by the Mid Essex Alliance, part of Mid and South Essex Integrated Care System (ICS) to share this important information with you. Across mid and south Essex, there is continued pressure on local health systems. **Data shows that there is increasing paediatric emergency presentation in local A&E departments. However, for much of the time, the outcome of the attendance is recorded as self-care/advice and no treatment is given.**

As a response, the ICS has re-launched a campaign to promote the **Children's Health Matters guide**, updated with new information for winter 2022/23. The free guide was co-designed with local parents and is packed with expert advice and guidance on what to do when children are unwell with common childhood illnesses. **It explains how to treat children at home, when to see a GP or call 111, and when symptoms are more serious and you should seek emergency help.**

In addition to the CHM guide, they have a family health newsletter that families can subscribe to - subscribers get 10 weekly email newsletters each covering a different aspect of family health and wellbeing - the link to subscribe is below:

This is the eligibility criteria ECC use: <u>Entitlement and what is required</u>

The Government set the criteria for free school meal entitlement. To be entitled, you need to receive: Universal Credit with an annual income of £7,400 or less

- Income Support
- Income Based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income Related Employment & Support Allowance
- Pension Guarantee Credit
- Child Tax Credit (But not working tax credit) with an annual income of less than £16,190
- Parents with Asylum Seeker status who receive support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Working Tax Credit 'Run-on' the payment someone may receive for a further 4 weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
