#### Welcome back!

I hope that you all enjoyed a restful break over the Easter holidays. We are looking forward to lots of events over the coming months and a list of key dates is included at the end of the newsletter. Already this term the children in Class Cuckoo have kicked-started their topic with an online learning session with the Royal Observatory and I know they are keen to find out more about our solar system and space. Today we also have our first girls' football match against Great Leigh's Primary School, so the team is very excited.

As you will see from the list, there are lots of sporting events coming up as well as class educational off-site visits; letters about each event with more details will come out in due course. Our annual Sports Day, Picnic and Open Afternoon have been put in for Friday 14<sup>th</sup> July and we do hope that parents and families will be able to reserve this date ahead of time and join us.

Before the events get fully underway, school has to administer the statutory assessments for pupils in Year 6, Year 2, Year 4 and Year 1. For the children in Year 6 this comprises a full set of tests in Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling, Reading and several Maths papers and we have a set timetable to follow so it is vital that you do not book appointments such as dentists during the test times. Year 2 pupils also have to sit a full range of written assessments but we can be more flexible on dates and times. Miss Johnston and Mrs McIntosh have invited Year 2 parents to a meeting on Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> May at 9.15am to find out more. The pupils in Year 1 will have their Phonics Screening activity which is administered by the class teachers on a one-to-one basis and from past experience the children really enjoy this opportunity to read real and "alien" words. In Year 4 the children have their online multiplication tests and again they enjoy using the tablets to show their rapid recall of number facts. For the Year 1 and 4 assessments we have a window in which to administer the tests but it is important that absences are minimised during this time. All results will be shared with parents in the end of year pupil reports in July.

We always approach the tests in a supportive and encouraging way but if you are at all concerned, please speak with the class teachers who will be able to reassure you.

#### **Class Budgerigar: Author Visit**

Just before we broke up for Easter, we were delighted to welcome Mr. Andrew Wiltshire- a member of our Danbury community and grandfather of Zachary in Year 5 - for a talk on being an author. All the children had many questions about what it takes to write well, what books Mr. Wiltshire read as a child (lots of materials by Sir Arthur Conan Doyle!) and his inspirations.





The pupils were encouraged to 'store' memories and 'just write'. As we know, reading is tremendously important, not only to access the wider world but to ignite our imaginations; Mr. Wiltshire told us about how he read avidly as a child. Our class now have a larger 'toolkit' for writing effectively than they did before!

#### **Year 1 Teddy Lympics**

Last term 16 Year 1 children were invited to the Teddy Lympics in Chelmsford. The children were really excited as we got to go on a coach there. In total there were over 50 teams that took part in the two day competition. It all started with a parade around the sports hall with the children waving their flags. The children did different activities that included, balancing, hurdles, throwing, javelin, skipping with a hoop and side speed jumping. After each activity the children had stamps, pens, paper cutters and other fun things to do to their teddy flag!















On the day, out of 16 teams Class Goldfinch came first and Class Hummingbird second! Poppy in Class Goldfinch won a Special Achievement Award for her speed jumping skills!

We then found out, that out of the schools that took part Class Goldfinch came 2<sup>nd</sup> and Class Hummingbird 7<sup>th</sup>! I think we can all agree that this was an amazing achievement for the school and the children.

Not only did the children get an amazing result, they were so well behaved and were a real credit to the school! Well done to all the children who took part in the competition. As you can see from the photos the children had a fantastic time!

#### **Attendance**

#### **Important information - Term time holidays**

Improving school attendance is a key priority for all schools across Essex. Where families choose to take a family holiday during term time, this can detrimentally impact a pupil's progress and can prevent them from fulfilling their true academic potential. Our school attendance policy, available via our school website, clearly sets out the process that parents should follow if they wish to apply for leave during term time. Please note that applications should only be made, if you feel that there are exceptional circumstances which mean that the leave cannot be taken during the school holidays.

We would ask all parents to note that, where families choose to go on holiday during term time and the absences are coded as unauthorised, Essex County Council may not issue penalty notices and may instead proceed to prosecution and place the case directly before the Magistrates for their consideration in court. If found guilty by the Magistrates, parents could face a fine of up to £2,500 and/or 3 months imprisonment.

# Find out what to do if your child is unwell



We have been contacted by the Mid Essex Alliance, part of Mid and South Essex Integrated Care System (ICS) to share this important information with you. Across mid and south Essex, there is continued pressure on local health systems. Data shows that there is increasing paediatric emergency presentation in local A&E departments. However, for much of the time, the outcome of the attendance is recorded as self-care/advice and no treatment is given.

As a response, the ICS has re-launched a campaign to promote the **Children's Health Matters guide**, updated with new information for winter 2022/23. The free guide was co-designed with local parents and is packed with expert advice and guidance on what to do when children are unwell with common childhood illnesses. **It explains** how to treat children at home, when to see a GP or call 111, and when symptoms are more serious and you should seek emergency help.

In addition to the CHM guide, they have a family health newsletter that families can subscribe to - subscribers get 10 weekly email newsletters each covering a different aspect of family health and wellbeing - the link to subscribe is below:

#### **Entitlement and what is required**

The Government set the criteria for free school meal entitlement. To be entitled, you need to receive: Universal Credit with an annual income of £7,400 or less

- Income Support
- Income Based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income Related Employment & Support Allowance
- Pension Guarantee Credit
- Child Tax Credit (But not working tax credit) with an annual income of less than £16,190
- Parents with Asylum Seeker status who receive support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Working Tax Credit 'Run-on' the payment someone may receive for a further 4 weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
