Weekly news

We start with some good news and congratulations to Mrs Stone, Class Jay's teacher (and her husband) on the birth of their baby boy yesterday evening! Mother and baby are doing well.

As the term is getting underway, we are starting to look at the events that we have planned and wanted to give parents and particularly those who are new to the school, information about how events work.

Statutory Government Tests

As explained a few weeks ago, we make these tests and tasks as pressure-free and as comfortable for the children as possible. In Year 6 we follow the set timetable but aim to get the tests started as soon as possible in the morning so that we finish by break time. The children are then given some free time to relax. We start the Year 2 tests next week as well. These are more relaxed as we can fit them in around our working

We start the Year 2 tests next week as well. These are more relaxed as we can fit them in around our working week and spread them over several weeks. We hope parents found the meeting with Miss Johnston and Mrs McIntosh on Wednesday useful.

In June the Year 1s will do their phonics screening and the children genuinely enjoy working one-to-one with their class teacher. The Year 4s will do their timed multiplication tests using our new i-pads and they have been practising in class, so it is nothing new. Parents will get results of the assessments in the end of year written reports.

Online Safety

On **Tuesday 23rd May** the 2 Johns will be visiting school and they will be working with all children, except those in EYFS, at an age-appropriate level about keeping safe online. The 2 Johns are ex-police officers with a wealth of experience and knowledge about the internet and the potential dangers. In the evening starting at **7.00pm** they will be holding a workshop for parents in the school hall and we would like as many parents as possible to attend. You do not need to book a place, just turn up ready to start at 7.00pm. The workshop lasts around an hour with an opportunity for questions afterwards. Even if you are tech-savvy, you do need to hear their stories and their message. They explain how parents can support their children on their journey through the digital world and they are very good at helping parents see this world through a child's eye.

To have the 2 Johns in school for the whole day is very costly but it is very worthwhile. We are grateful to the DPSA for paying for this event. We tend to hold it every other year but without their support, we could not fund it as a school without making a cut elsewhere. Your support for the DPSA helps them support the children! Thank you.

Safeguarding **Mental Health and Well-being**

In school we work closely with bccs, who provide us with expert counselling, support and training. The charity is also available to work with families outside school and parents can contact them directly:

Child and Family Counselling Services

Parents are now able to access direct support for their child by referring them into the safe hands of our Child and Family Counselling Services (CFCS). We have a team of highly experienced Counsellors, Specialist Child and Adolescent Counsellors and Play Therapists available within the counselling team who work in our specially adapted therapy rooms.

We offer support to children, young people and parents through talking, play and art therapy.

CFCS provides therapy to children, young people and families. We support many different issues such as:

- Self-harm
- Bullying Bereavement
- Identity Anxiety
- Parental separation and family issues or conflict.

The pathway is overseen by our Head of Child and Family Counselling Services, who is supported by a team that are both passionate about and dedicated to the wellbeing of children and young people. The team has achieved very positive and reparative outcomes for children and families.

What can you expect?

After an initial contact, we will arrange an assessment to explore the issues your child may be experiencing and will then identify which model best supports the difficulty your child may be facing.

Attendance

Important information - Term time holidays

Improving school attendance is a key priority for all schools across Essex. Where families choose to take a family holiday during term time, this can detrimentally impact a pupil's progress and can prevent them from fulfilling their true academic potential. Our school attendance policy, available via our school website, clearly sets out the process that parents should follow if they wish to apply for leave during term time. Please note that applications should only be made, if you feel that there are exceptional circumstances which mean that the leave cannot be taken during the school holidays.

We would ask all parents to note that, where families choose to go on holiday during term time and the absences are coded as unauthorised, Essex County Council may not issue penalty notices and may instead proceed to prosecution and place the case directly before the Magistrates for their consideration in court. If found guilty by the Magistrates, parents could face a fine of up to £2,500 and/or 3 months imprisonment.

We have been contacted by the Mid Essex Alliance, part of Mid and South Essex Integrated Care System (ICS) to share this important information with you. Across mid and south Essex, there is continued pressure on local health systems. Data shows that there is increasing paediatric emergency presentation in local A&E departments. However, for much of the time, the outcome of the attendance is recorded as self-care/advice and no treatment is given.

As a response, the ICS has re-launched a campaign to promote the **Children's Health Matters guide**, updated with new information for winter 2022/23. The free guide was co-designed with local parents and is packed with expert advice and guidance on what to do when children are unwell with common childhood illnesses. **It explains** how to treat children at home, when to see a GP or call 111, and when symptoms are more serious and you should seek emergency help.

In addition to the CHM guide, they have a family health newsletter that families can subscribe to - subscribers get 10 weekly email newsletters each covering a different aspect of family health and wellbeing - the link to subscribe is below:

This is the eligibility criteria ECC use:

Entitlement and what is required

The Government set the criteria for free school meal entitlement. To be entitled, you need to receive: Universal Credit with an annual income of £7,400 or less

- Income Support
- Income Based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income Related Employment & Support Allowance
- Pension Guarantee Credit
- Child Tax Credit (But not working tax credit) with an annual income of less than £16,190
- Parents with Asylum Seeker status who receive support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Working Tax Credit 'Run-on' the payment someone may receive for a further 4 weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
