

Overview of Unit 11: What's the time

In this 'What's the Time?' unit, your class will learn how to tell the time: o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to. They will learn how to read timetables and TV schedules and answer simple questions about these. The unit is drawn together with a final lesson which is a mathematics lesson, calculating the difference between two times. To support non-specialists, there are sound files of all key vocabulary plus extra teacher guidance (where necessary) at the end of each lesson plan.
