### Weekly News

This week a group of our Year 1 children went with Mrs Smith to the *Teddy Lympics* at Chelmsford Athletics Stadium. This is an event run by the Chelmsford School Sport Partnership, of which Danbury Park is a member, and where the children compete in teams against other schools in a variety of fun physical activities.

In our group our teams came 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> out of the 16 teams participating that day, which was a great start. Over several days 48 teams took part in total, which included an amazing 384 children. Overall, we came joint 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup>.



Thank you to Mrs Smith for accompanying the teams and well done to the children, who all said that they had a fun time!

As you will know we have a Daily Mile track on the field that all children use as part of their PE lessons but that is used by the KS2 children at lunchtimes to encourage them to be active. We had a team of three *Get Active Promoters*, who support the children and encourage them. Mrs Fox is currently on maternity leave and sadly Mrs Day moved on at the end of last academic year. After Christmas Mrs Williams will be reducing her days to Thursdays and Fridays. The Daily Mile runs best when we have adults to organise and support the children so we are looking to recruit some new promoters to work over the lunchtime period. You need to enjoy working with children and also be a good role model through being physically active and organising additional challenges for the children along the way. Dame Rachel De Souza  
Children's Commissioner for England**

We have been asked to share this message and survey about the national campaign *The Big Ambition* with the children and parents within our school community.:

*It is really important that the pupils at Danbury Park Community Primary School have participated in The Big Ambition survey and had their say. Children or parents can complete the survey here:*

*I want to ensure that the voices of all children in the Chelmsford area are fairly represented in the findings so that I can share their views with the most senior members of the country.*

*I must reiterate that it is vital that all children have their voice heard through this survey because, as Children's Commissioner for England, I have a statutory duty to protect and promote the views and interests of children. The Big Ambition provides a much-needed opportunity for the children of England to tell political decision makers what is important to them ahead of the General Election. I will be sharing their responses with Government to ensure that children's voices are heard.*

**Car Park**

We are aware that the car park at the front of the school is again causing problems for parents and visitors. Last year Mrs Ireland, KS2 Lead and Class Dove's teacher, spent a lot of time in the morning directing traffic but her priority is the education of the children and she is needed in class - learning starts as soon as the children come into school. We have signs to show where cars should not be parked but these are disregarded and parents abandon their cars in the middle of the car park causing an obstruction and not allowing the traffic to flow through. This causes traffic to back up on Well Lane and Main Road which is dangerous for pedestrians. We have even had parents blocking staff in and parking across the entrance to the staff car park which prevents staff entering and leaving the site.

We know that the car park is developing some potholes and I am in communication with Danbury Outdoors about this. Unfortunately, neither establishment has any spare funds to carry out repairs, so we are considering what we can do. We are speaking with Essex County Council about this but if anyone has any connections with companies that carry out repairs, please let the school office know.

We all need to use the carpark with consideration but also safely so that no-one gets injured.

## Christmas Events



As Christmas is fast approaching and we have lots of events planned, we thought parents might appreciate a full list of what is coming up!

**Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> December 12.00 – 2.00pm** - DPSA Christmas Fayre. There will be a range of stalls and activities as well as Father Christmas so we hope that we will see lots of families getting in the festive spirit and supporting the DPSA.

**Monday 4<sup>th</sup> Dec until Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> Dec** - Every year we hold a toy collection in aid of Chelmsford Children's Social Care Services and we will again be doing this. This year more than ever, there are children in our local area, who need our support. Families are invited to bring in a new or very nearly new toy, game, puzzle etc. wrapped in Christmas paper to put under the tree in the hall. Please leave one end of the donation open and label it clearly "boy aged 5 – 7" as appropriate, so a 10 year old does not get a baby's rattle! Donations may be left under the Christmas tree in the hall. **Please note that there is only a short window for gifts to be brought into school as we are very tight on space at this time of year.**

**Monday 4<sup>th</sup> Dec** – The Christmas post-box will go out so that the children can post their cards during morning registration. Please make sure each envelope is clearly labelled with the recipient's name and class as this helps our Year 6 deliverers. As a school that is working hard to protect our environment, we ask that the children consider the impact of sending cards and maybe only do this for close friends. After Christmas, the school will have a recycling bin specially for cards at the front entrance, which will be there for our community to use. More information to follow shortly.

**Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> Dec at 9.30am and again at 2.30pm** – The infant children will perform *Are we nearly there yet?*

**Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> Dec at 9.30am and again at 1.45pm** - The junior children will perform *A Hint of Snow White*.

**Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> Dec** – Christmas dinner will take place and there is no need to book in advance. We are inviting the children to wear a Christmas jumper or t-shirt to school that day with their school skirt/pinafore or trousers so that we all look very festive.

**Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> Dec** - Christmas parties will take place amongst the classes in the afternoon and the children can bring in some party clothes to change into after dinner. We will end the day with a whole school Christmas sing-a-long.

On **Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> November** Mr Lawday, our caretaker, and I will be putting up the stage. The stage is quite easy to assemble but is very heavy. ## Safeguarding

## Emergency School Closures – SNOW!

As we approach the time of year when inclement weather and snow is more likely, we would like to advise you of the school's emergency closure procedure. The decision to close the school is never taken lightly but there may be rare times when the site is unsafe or insufficient staff can get into the school and closure is unavoidable. Please note that the local radio stations no longer give out announcements.

We will also put a message out on Parentmail and on the scrolling news on the first page of the school website. We will aim to do this by 7.30am.

If the weather and traffic are bad, please take care and get to school safely. We will understand if you delay your journey and arrive later than the usual time.

If you have not yet joined *Parentmail*, please ask at the office.



## Attendance

Part of our safeguarding duties and procedures is ensuring that when children are absent from school, we know where they are and that they are safe. Please remember to inform school by **9.20am each day** if your child is absent from school and to follow this up with a written letter of explanation on their return. If we do not know where your child is, we are required to use the emergency contact numbers you have given to school. So, it is vitally important that if you change your phone numbers, or your family and friends do, that you inform us.

The government, local authority and school take attendance seriously and school is required to follow up on irregular attendance and prolonged absences and also for unauthorised absences, so please do not be offended when we ask for proof of doctors' and dentists' appointment or ask for details of holiday bookings or delayed flights or sickness on return after school holidays. The government is also asking parents to send their children into school with mild illnesses and we would, of course, contact you should their condition deteriorate.

## Important information - Term time holidays

Improving school attendance is a key priority for all schools across Essex. Where families choose to take a family holiday during term time, this can detrimentally impact a pupil's progress and can prevent them from fulfilling their true academic potential. Our school attendance policy, available via our school website, clearly sets out the process that parents should follow if they wish to apply for leave during term time. Please note that applications should only be made, if you feel that there are exceptional circumstances which mean that the leave cannot be taken during the school holidays.

**We would ask all parents to note that, where families choose to go on holiday during term time and the absences are coded as unauthorised, Essex County Council may not issue penalty notices and may instead proceed to prosecution and place the case directly before the Magistrates for their consideration in court.** If found guilty by the Magistrates, parents could face a fine of up to £2,500 and/or 3 months imprisonment.

**Last week we had a number of children arriving after 8.55am when the school gate had been locked. Unless your child has permission to walk to school on their own, parents MUST bring their child into the school office in order to sign them in and give a reason for their lateness. This way you know that they have been handed over to our care and are safely in school.**

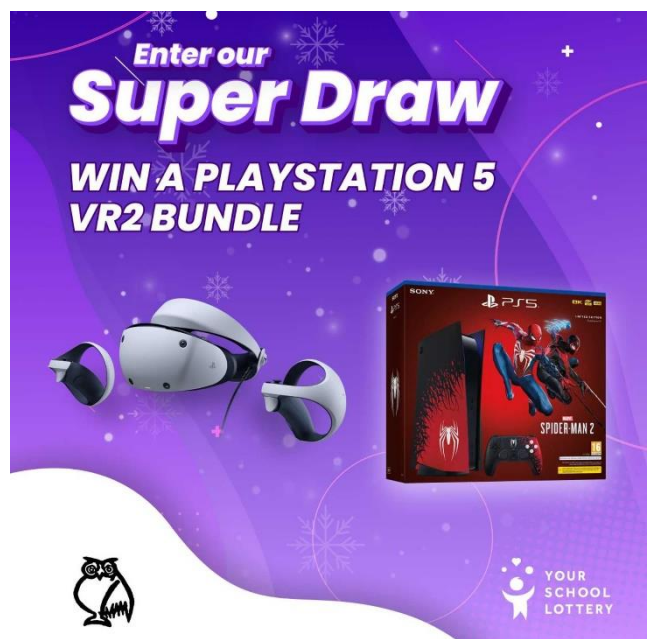
## Danbury Park School Lottery

## Child and Family Counselling Services

Parents are now able to access direct support for their child by referring them into the safe hands of our Child and Family Counselling Services (CFCS). We have a team of highly experienced Counsellors, Specialist Child and Adolescent Counsellors and Play Therapists available within the counselling team who work in our specially adapted therapy rooms.



We offer support to children, young people and parents through talking, play and art therapy.

CFCS provides therapy to children, young people and families. We support many different issues such as:

- Self-harm
- Identity
- Anxiety
- Bullying
- Bereavement
- Parental separation and family issues or conflict.

The pathway is overseen by our Head of Child and Family Counselling Services, who is supported by a team that are both passionate about and dedicated to the wellbeing of children and young people. The team has achieved very positive and reparative outcomes for children and families.

### What can you expect?

After an initial contact, we will arrange an assessment to explore the issues your child may be experiencing and will then identify which model best supports the difficulty your child may be facing.

## Notification and Reminders

**School Gateway** – Thank you to all the parents who have now joined the new online payment system. Please ensure that you download the app as per the letter sent out at the end of last term. Payments for school dinners and trips need to be made via this app. Please note that we are now well on our way to being a cashless school as part of *Our World, Our Future* project. By having the online system, staff need to make fewer journeys by car to the bank, thus reducing emissions and we are using less paper.

**Measles** – The Primary Health Care Trust has asked us to remind parents about the measles vaccine, which is available through GP surgeries. They are anxious to vaccinate all children to prevent an outbreak of a potentially dangerous disease.

**Ink Pens** – We have now moved away from using fountain pens in the classroom and will going forward encourage the children to use Berol Writing Pens. These will be provided by the school.

**Free School Meals** – Due to Covid-19 we understand that your circumstances may have changed or may change in the near future and you may now be eligible for free school meals. To check eligibility please contact Essex County Council on 0345 603 2200 or for more information and online application go to <https://www.gov.uk/apply-free-school-meals>

This is the eligibility criteria ECC use:





### Entitlement and what is required

The Government set the criteria for free school meal entitlement. To be entitled, you need to receive:

- Universal Credit with an annual income of £7,400 or less
- Income Support
- Income Based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income Related Employment & Support Allowance
- Pension Guarantee Credit
- Child Tax Credit (But not working tax credit) with an annual income of less than £16,190
- Parents with Asylum Seeker status who receive support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Working Tax Credit 'Run-on' – the payment someone may receive for a further 4 weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
